HOW TO ACCESS MEDICAL SERVICES

Our current online consultation system is called Accurx Patient Triage. Accurx can be accessed via our website. There is no login or password required, its as easy as clicking the link and submitting a request to us.

Medical requests open each day at 8am and are suspended when we reach capacity for appointments. Admin requests remain open and our phone lines are available during opening hours. This can be used for a variety of things such as requesting a prescription, test results, checking referral status. We aim to respond to you on the same day, or the next working day for requests submitted on a weekend.
