Accessing the Practice

Our current online consultation system is called **Accurx Patient Triage.** We no longer use AskMyGp. Accurx can be accessed via our website. There is no login or password required, its as easy as clicking the link and submitting a request to us. Medical requests open each day at 8am and are suspended when we reach capacity for appointments. Admin requests remain open. This can be used for a variety of things such as requesting a prescription, test results, checking referral status. We aim to respond to you on the same day, or the next working day for requests submitted on a weekend.

We also offer a limited number of pre-bookable GP appointments. Practice Nurse and Health Care Assistant face to face appointments can be booked in advance by calling our care navigator team during opening hours.

We also offer face to face and telephone appointments with clinicians at our enhanced access service (GP+) that can be booked on the day or in advance. We may offer you an appointment here as they are able to offer appointments when we cannot, making more appointments available for patients. They have GP's, Practice and Staff nurses, Phlebotomists, HCA, Community Practitioners and Pharmacists.

Flu Vaccinations

We are now booking in Flu vaccinations. Eligible patients please contact the surgery to book in.

Why is flu vaccination important?

Flu vaccination is important because, while flu is unpleasant for most people, it can be dangerous and even life threatening for some people, particularly those with certain health conditions.



The best time to have your flu vaccine is in the autumn or early winter before flu starts spreading. But you can get your vaccine later.

Who can have the flu vaccine?

The flu vaccine is given free on the NHS to adults who:

- are 65 and over (including those who will be 65 by 31 March 2024)
- have certain health conditions
- are pregnant
- are in long-stay residential care
- receive a carer's allowance, or are the main carer for an older or disabled person who may be at risk if you get sick
- live with someone who is more likely to get a severe infection due to a weakened immune system, such as someone living with HIV, someone who has had a transplant, or is having certain treatments for cancer, lupus or rheumatoid arthritis

If you would like a flu vaccination but are not eligible you can arrange one with your local pharmacy for a small fee.

COVID-19 Vaccinations

COVID-19 vaccination is an important part of protecting yourself if you're at increased risk from severe COVID-19.

Who is eligible for a seasonal COVID-19 vaccine

You or your child may be offered a seasonal COVID-19 vaccine if you are:

- aged 65 years old or over (you need to be 65 years old by 31 March 2024)
- aged 6 months to 64 years old and are at increased risk
- living in a care home for older adults
- a frontline health or social care worker
- aged 16 to 64 years old and are a carer
- aged 12 to 64 years old and live with someone with a weakened immune system

How to get a seasonal COVID-19 vaccine

If you're eligible, you can get a seasonal COVID-19 vaccine by:

- booking online
- booking on the NHS App
- going to a walk-in COVID-19 vaccination site
- call 119



Annual Reviews



Having a single annual review is the quickest and most convenient way of monitoring long-term conditions. Without regular check-ups, conditions can worsen and complications might arise that damage your health.

To ensure that patients with long-term conditions only have to attend the Practice when necessary, we now invite these patients to attend the Practice for a single annual review.

This normally requires an appointment with a Health Care Assistant (HCA) or Practice Nurse for blood tests, and checks of height, weight, blood pressure, and a urine test, usually followed by a face-to-face review.

In some circumstances the review can be completed simply with a telephone call to discuss the test results.

You will receive an invitation in advance of the planned review to allow time to book the necessary appointments. The conditions for which annual reviews are undertaken include:

- Diabetes
- Heart Failure
- Stroke
- Hypertension (high blood pressure)
- Atrial fibrillation
- Coronary Heart Disease
- Asthma
- Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD)
- Long term mental health problems
- Learning Disabilities
